

SUPPLEMENTARY REPORT FOR GUIDED ACTION PLAN

This plan has been prepared for First Last upon his request. Mr. Blank is currently serving a term of ?? years, with a projected release date of Month Year. The attached plan has been prepared in order to facilitate Mr. Blank's personal growth and rehabilitation, and to align his goals with the objective of positive programming and successful reentry upon release.

This plan was developed after taking into account Mr. Blank's past history factors. This plan identifies the areas of concern that Mr. Blank should focus on in order to lead a health life within prison or upon reentry. These factors include violence, gang history, criminality, substance use, and domestic violence.

The primary recommendations at the time of this writing are that Mr. Blank:

1. Complete something
2. Enroll in and complete something
3. Pursue something
4. Develop something

The rationale for the recommendations above are as follows:

Current estimates are that a person with a high school diploma can expect to make up to \$42,000 per year in the market place on average. Obtaining his Associate's degree, Mr. Blank will increase his potential yearly income to \$50,000. With additional vocational training, Mr. Blank can anticipate learning skills and increasing his marketability for even higher income. During his initial interview, Mr. Blank stated that he believed the following were his greatest opportunities offered him currently. Upon achieving his Associate's degree, should he pursue a Bachelor's degree, his potential yearly income will increase to an average of \$69,000ⁱ.

Additionally, research has shown that the national recidivism rate is around 70%, yet offenders who complete vocational training can reduce the rate down to 30%. An Associate's degree reduces the recidivism rate to 13.7%, and a Bachelor's degree down to 5.6%ⁱⁱ.

Regarding self-help groups, Mr. Blank has enrolled in stuff. That noted, considering his relevant past history factors, it is recommended that Mr. Blank invest time and energy into taking the recommended courses in this plan. The point being to identify the core issues that may have led him to take such actions in the past, then to develop relapse prevention plans for those very issues. During his interview, Mr. Blank stated that he said some stuff. Further, the recommended courses would serve Mr. Blank in gaining a better understanding of Victim Impact, which again could act as a deterrent to relapse into violent or criminal behavior.

It is noted that Mr. Blank has voluntarily agreed to participate in various programming, that he can see a viable vision for himself in terms of education, and that he places a high value on many things. The recommendations to take certain courses are and develop things are recommended as possible areas for growth that could potentially balance and ground Mr. Blank as he moves forward in his endeavors.

Upon completion of this plan Mr. Blank will have obtained his education, become certified in vocational training, acquired at least five certificates of completion from the courses recommended, gained skills in various areas of rehabilitation. Further, Mr. Blank will have gained RAC and Milestone credits that will

bring his release date closer, will have a working resume, and a more developed grasp on the subject of financial literacy for when he enters into the job market.

The enclosed plan is by no means exhaustive and should be used as a guideline, keeping in mind the need for contingencies and the fact that changes may arise within the institution and/or policies.
